## **BILATERAL INVESTMENT TREATIES: DO STATES HAVE A SAY IN HOW THEIR TREATIES ARE INTERPRETED?**

2009 marks the 40<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the Vienna Convention on the Law of Treaties. In the rapidly expanding field of investment arbitration, generally, only one State party to the investment treaty is a party to the arbitration. The lecture will examine the implications for States with respect to the findings of arbitral tribunals relating to the interpretation of a treaty to which they are a party when they have not participated in the arbitration proceedings.

Mr Bundy has acted as counsel and advocate for governments and multinationals in areas of public international law and international commercial arbitration.
